## **About the Local History Museum**

Children may be completely unfamiliar with the life and culture of mere decades ago. The Local History Museum unravels the past in ways that are easy to understand for children by introducing how people lived during the Showa 30s (mid-1950s to the mid-1960s). The Museum also aims to help visitors deepen their understanding of the origin and the history of Toyoyama Town through the display of historical objects and materials that have been donated to the museum, as well as through videos and interactive items.
