

The History of Toyoyama Town

Toyoyama is a town blessed with nature, with warm weather and abundant water sources. Since the olden days, Toyoyama has developed as a pure farming town and an important hub for transportation.

In the post-war years, during the era of rapid economic growth, Toyoyama grew literally by leaps and bounds as an important center for the aviation industry. After the town administration came into effect, the National Route 41 (connecting Nagoya and Toyama) was organized, which was followed by the establishment of the Nagoya City Central Wholesale Hokubu Market and large commercial complexes.

While the "Aircraft Museum Boon" and the "Aichi Museum of Flight" continue to attract visitors as popular sites for industrial tourism in aviation, the local people are also enthusiastically involved in traditional arts such as kiyari (chanting by workmen pulling heavy loads) and kagura (sacred dancing and music performed at shrines), as well as traditional events such as yakusai, or rituals to ward off evil.
